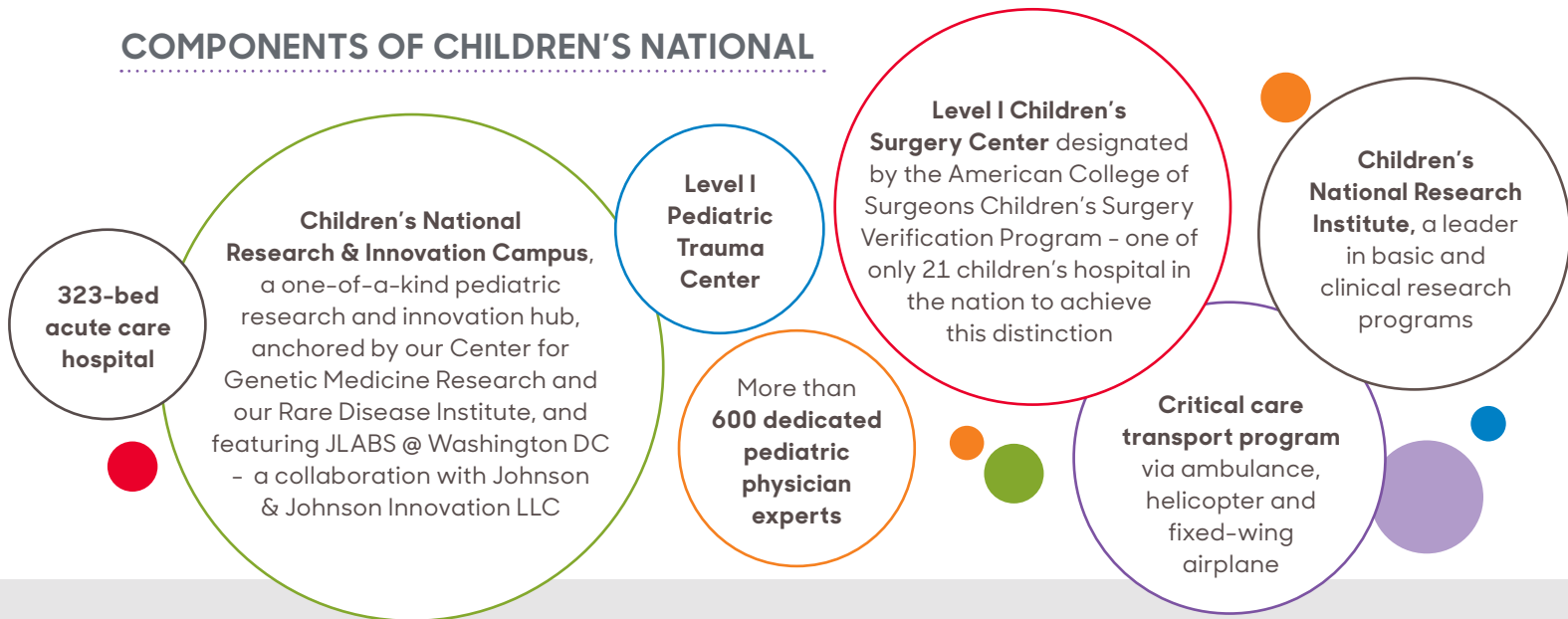

Our team understands the challenges of traveling abroad for medical care, and we work diligently in coordinating the clinical and logistical aspects of the visit, making sure that each patient's unique cultural, linguistic and religious needs are being met. Our international patients have 24/7 access to a robust team of doctors, nurses, coordinators and interpreters, ensuring that our patients get timely appointments, easy access to information, and facilitating communication with health care providers.

Our campus in the heart of Washington, D.C., provides families with access to the country's richest cultural experiences while receiving care at Children's National. Washington, D.C., is a cosmopolitan center that still retains a small-town ambience and offers a variety of choices for our travelling patients, from hotel accommodations to restaurants and attractions.

1. BECOMING A PATIENT



- Multilingual staff is dedicated to delivering personalized care and support to international patients and families.
- Our team advocates on behalf of the patient and family to facilitate care coordination and understanding of financial responsibilities, and to act as your liaison.
- Expedited access to top physicians in their field of expertise.

2. DURING TREATMENT



- Designated care coordinator assigned to each patient to facilitate all aspects of the treatment journey.
- State-of-the-art diagnostic equipment used by renowned experts to provide the most advanced treatments available.
- Patient-Family Centered Care approach where senior physicians partner with families to create an individualized treatment plan for your child.

3. RETURNING HOME



- To ensure continuity of care as the patient returns home, we ensure a seamless transition of care to the patient's local treating physicians.
- Patient receives a comprehensive digital record that is also shared with their local health care team.
- Our team serves as an ongoing resource for patients through our telehealth or remote medical second opinion program to ensure a continuum of care for life.
